### **Christian Love**

The greatest and most important commandment in all of divine revelation is that you love God with your whole heart, your whole soul, your whole strength and with your whole mind (see Mt 22:37).

This means that you are called to love God above everyone and everything - even above yourself. You allow no selfish desire or sin to come before his will. God has first place in your life. For he is your supreme good, the one who created you and constantly sustains you in existence. "In him we live and move and have our being" (Ac 17:28). He is the life of your life, the soul of your soul. He provides for you from moment to moment. God is the one who redeems you. His infinite love surrounds and penetrates you and continues to save and free you even now. He is worthy of your greatest love. That is why you are commanded to love him.

The second commandment is like the first: it is of the same order and importance; it commands you to *love your neighbor as yourself*. Everything that God has ever said can thus be summed up in the word *love* – love of God and neighbor.

The same love is directed to both God and fellow man and woman. The two are so closely related that they perfect each other. Growth in love for God brings with it a greater love for neighbor. On the other hand, scripture says, "If we love one another God dwells in us and his love is brought to perfection in us" (1 Jn 4:12).

Divine love in you grows stronger and matures through your love for others. The two are so connected that love for the unseen God is proven by loving your neighbor whom you can see. It is impossible to love God and be unconcerned for others at the same time. A person who closes his heart to one in need has also closed his heart to God. Jesus said that whatever you do for others you actually do for him. True love for God expresses itself in deeds of love for others. This love for others is so important that should someone hold something against you, you first need to make up with him or her before you can be properly disposed to worship God.

### The New Commandment

Love is Jesus' new commandment. He has taken the commandment to "love your neighbor as yourself" even further. He wants you to love as he loved. He would have you give your life for others in service and self-sacrifice. This is the highest kind of love that you can have. This is Christian love or agape. It is the definitive sign of a true follower of Jesus. This is the kind of love that indicates that you are Jesus' intimate friend. It calls for the total gift of goods and self. It urges you to "sell what you have and give to the poor," then to dedicate yourself entirely to the service of others – like Jesus did.

Your state of life may not allow you to dispose of your property so that you can be wholly free to dedicate yourself and your time to the service of others. But you may keep yourself free from possessiveness and preoccupation with material goods and try to use them for the service of those whose lives are mingled with yours. You will then have more time and psychic energy to devote yourself wholeheartedly to others. The love of neighbor demands just as total a renunciation as does the love of God. Perfect Christian love means that you give yourself over totally to the other – to God in obedience and consecration, to neighbor in compassion and dedicated service. Freedom and independence are given up for the sake of the loved one – which includes even the "enemy". No one can love in this way unless he gives up his own pleasure, his own convenience and even his own rights.



This is asking a great deal of you, isn't it? Humanly speaking it is impossible for you to be so self-giving. Human nature is of itself too selfish to love that much, that selflessly. But God can make it possible for you to at least come close to loving that much, if not entirely so, as some of the saints seem to have done. The Holy Spirit himself can gradually take over your life and do through you what you could never do by your own unaided human power. He may have already put the desire in your heart to strive for that supreme kind of love that Jesus calls you to. This desire is an ideal to live for even if you know that you are far from it.

The fervor of your desire and the strain and struggle which you exert to reach that ideal will gradually purify and transform you and, in great measure, make up for your weak love for others. When you fail to measure up to the ideal of love, you remember that human nature is weak. You do not become discouraged. You know that it takes time and patience and much effort, along with failure, which schools you in humility, before your human nature can be transformed and empowered to love divinely. God knows this better than you and is infinitely patient. He knows the difficulty and how slow and long the journey is to perfect love. But this is what he asks you to attempt, little by little, as much as you can. Remember that great accomplishments begin with small steps. All you need to do is to begin making those small steps.

Each little act of love has eternal value and has repercussions in you and in the one for whom you do it; it is transforming – even if it goes by unrecognized or unappreciated. God does not expect the impossible of you. He only wants you to do your best. He is there to help you, to strengthen you each step of the way or to pick you up when you fall. The encouraging factor is that desiring and attempting to love is already in fact loving and you are opening yourself up to invasion of the Holy Spirit who will gradually take over your life and enable you to love divinely.
