For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved, it is the power of God (Cor 1:18).

You must have noticed how often Jesus told people not to tell that he was the Messiah. Similarly, he did not want them to broadcast his miracles. All of this is because they had the wrong idea of what he was about. People wanted to use him for temporal reasons – for example, to acquire health, food or prestige – to make earthly life easier, or to escape pain, labor or inconvenience. But that is not what his mission was for!

True, he did perform miracles to show that the Father had sent him, that he was the Messiah. But his own disciples as well as the rest of the people were indisposed to hear how he would accomplish his mission. They turned him off when he tried to explain (Mk 8:32). They had glorious preconceptions that differed drastically from God's plan (Mk 10:37). What was God's plan for Jesus and us to attain salvation (see Mk 8:27-38)? If you live according to the truth and accept God's will in human life as it unfolds, you will have to suffer in life and experience rejection by those who live for pleasure and who worship the god of this world. But in this way, instead of being undone or destroyed by suffering, mistreatment and hard times you will undergo a transformation. That part of you (the spiritual) which is most beautiful, the indestructible, the holy and true will be made to come out of you. It's like the pains of childbirth which cause a woman to produce a new creation.

Jesus is saying, then, that life's trials and difficulties are in the process of bringing the best out of us – if we let them, if we humbly and lovingly submit to the divine order of things in life. That means we accept human life as it is experienced in an imperfect world with its limitations, failings, disappointments, and sins. Strange as it may seem, these will transform us. So, we need to face them, rather than to flee from them. It is by going through them that we are brought to perfection.



Lent: A Call to Conversion – A Time of Transformation and a Change of Heart.

We have seen that holiness is the result of opening ourselves up to God with great desire so that he can give himself to us. This desire expresses itself with thirsting for God and seeking him with all our hearts. But this implies that we have already turned to God, that is, converted ourselves to him. This conversion to God supposes God's grace that has called and moved us. We convert ourselves to him insofar as we accept his touch of love. Our positive response in accepting his love is the first step in an unending series of graces that God is anxious to give us, *"love following upon love"* (Jn 1:16). So, ultimately, conversion is a gift of God, but we must cooperate and do our part by receiving it. That marks the beginning of our spiritual life.

Conversion to God supposes a turning away from something else. And this is why conversion is usually so difficult – we are turned to creatures and are thoroughly enjoying them. Moreover, the pleasure in them and the desire they elicit in us – in whatever form – blind our minds to spiritual realities. We are prevented from knowing and experiencing God. Our wills are weakened, and our hearts are enslaved. We are lulled and deceived by a false sense of security and counterfeit happiness (Lk 6:24-26).

Since conversion is the first step required to receive all the blessings God has in store for us, we can appreciate the supreme importance it has in our spiritual lives. One would think that it is something we would be anxious for! Yet, on the level of the senses, which we share with lower creation, we may be totally oblivious to the need to change. We may be perfectly content with the level of life we presently enjoy – a life that is dominated by the good, natural life. However good it may seem, it does not begin to compare with the spiritual (supernatural) life which the kingdom of God offers us. That is what Jesus implies when he said, "The reign of God is at hand! Reform your lives and believe in the gospel!" (Mk 1:15). However innocent natural human life may appear, it can cause us to ignore the good news and infuriate God (Mt 22: 1-7); earthly occupations can absorb our time, attention and energies, and offer easy excuses to prevent us from devoting ourselves to the kingdom of God. The Lord in his anger readily rejects these excuses (Lk 14: 16-24). Moreover, these so-called good things of earth cause us to lead mediocre lives that merit condemnation from a God who deserves so much more: *"Because you are lukewarm...I will spew you out of my mouth!...Little do you realize how wretched you are, how pitiable and poor, how blind and naked!" (Rev 3:16-17).*

However urgent and imperative is the call to conversion, it is not an easy matter. Even for those of us who have made the initial break with absorption in creatures, and who are called to a further, deeper conversion, there is the resistance of a tenacious human nature. We are to look to Jesus, therefore, for the grace of conversion that we are seeking – whatever new depth or degree that might be. We must be confident that he desires our turning ever more wholly to God even more than we do. He would do for us what he did for the rabid Saul (Acts 9:1-22), or the sinful woman (Lk 7:36-50), the money-loving Zacchaeus (Lk 19: 1-10) or the raving demoniac (Mk 5:1-20).

But we must do our part. Whatever small sacrifice we can make in order to attempt to dominate our senses, however we can deprive ourselves for the love of others, whatever time we can set aside to read the word of God and reflect upon it, will show God the seriousness of our desire for conversion and our willingness to dispose ourselves for this grace.

May this Lenten season lead us from one grace to another until we are fully transformed (2 Cor 3:18) and God becomes all in all (1 Cor 15:28). For this we long.....




