The Presentation of the Lord

The core of this mystery is the total consecration of this child to the Lord. The presentation is a consecration – a dedication and total gift of this child to God – nothing left for self. Everything about this child is for God – his whole being and activity is for God. He is a gift from God and must be given back to God. From now on, his whole life is for God. Isn't that beautiful? Isn't that the way our lives should be – a total gift to God?

Wouldn't it be beautiful if the moment we open our eyes in consciousness we would give ourselves over in total self-gift and consecration to God? Our whole day would be lived out in this self-gift to God in return for his gift of existence to ourselves...

What a beautiful way for us to live out this mystery of the Presentation – even moment by moment. It would take a special grace for this to happen. We would need to fling ourselves on God in prayer at the beginning of each day so God could take hold of us in total possession. In this way his

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Holy Spirit could move our every breath and heartbeat and action toward love for God and those we live or associate with. Wouldn't this be a heavenly life? That seems to be the kind of life that Simeon lived. He was living for God and awaited the messianic age, "the consolation of Israel" – the time where God's anointed one would pour out upon the world God's own Holy Spirit. He would sanctify all who were open to receive him. He would enable them to live holy and godly lives – totally dedicated to God.

God had revealed to Simeon that he would get to see the anointed one – the Messiah - before he died. This was the blessed moment that Simeon had been waiting for - the Holy Spirit enlightened him to realize that this child, Jesus, was surely God's anointed one! The glory of God shined through his human features: the light in his eyes, the glow of his smile, the radiance of his whole being! Filled with ecstatic joy, he broke out in thanksgiving and praise of God. "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles – [the nations], and glory for your people Israel."

When I was baptized, I was plunged into an intimate union with you. I began to live in you and you in me (Rom 6:3; Jn 14:20).

You come to me and give yourself to me again and again at every Mass during Holy Communion. As you live by the Father, so I, too, may live by the same divine life that you receive from him (**In 6:57**).

I can increase that divine life by receiving you daily at every Mass.

Every time I receive you fervently in Holy Communion, you wipe away every one of my petty sins and make my soul clean again.

If I have the misfortune of committing a serious sin, you make yourself available in the Sacrament of Reconciliation – not only do you take that sin away, but you strengthen me against any future falls; and you make me grow in humility and in a childlike dependence on you.

So, Lord, thanks to your infinite patience and loving mercy, you make me grow in leaps and bounds. Nothing can thus separate me from your love (**Rom 8:38-39**).

Lapses only make me appreciate you and love you all the more.

The sweetness of your divine love draws and impels me toward you, Lord Jesus. I pray that you will confirm me in this grace, in this desire to be absolutely faithful to you. I wish to commit myself anew to you, my divine Lord. Please! Never let me be separated from you! Strengthen me. Bind me to you definitively – so much so, that I will remain inextricably bound to you until the day you take me to be with you forever. You are my all, O Jesus! I want to live in your holy presence. I desire to live in continuous interpersonal communion with you, my merciful and gentle Lord. Even in necessary occupations and diversions, I desire to be like the bride in the canticle whose heart kept vigil for you (Sg 5:2).

It is only by your abundant grace that I can come near to carry out this desire. I love you, Lord! Please help me to love you as much as you deserve.


